A session on Gender Equality was organized by LPCPS on **20th September 2019**.

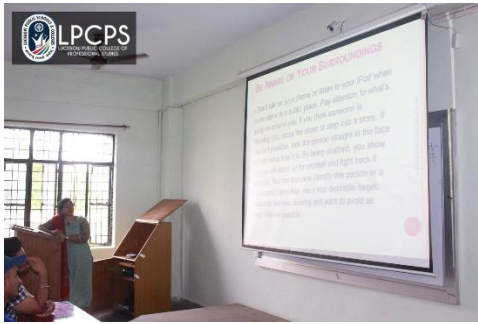

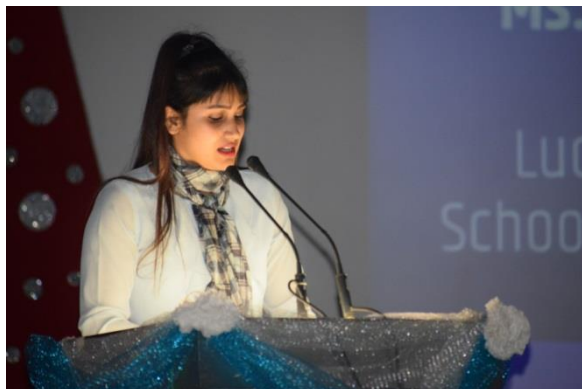

Awasthi** (LPCPS) spoke about the college how the team LPCPS is available round the clock to help as many students as possible and solve all their academic problems along with the many highlights of accomplishments, he also acknowledged the particular challenges that arose with the onset of the global COVID-19 pandemic.



The Inaugural session followed by **Mr. Harshit Singh**, (Director, LPCPS) encouraged the fullest potential of girls and women of all ages, ensure their full and equal participation in building a better world for all and enhance their role in the development process.

Distinguished online speakers such as **Dr. Avakash Jadhav** (Associate Professor, St. Xavier College, University of Mumbai) and **Dr. Ofure O.M. Aito** (Associate Professor, Federal University, Lokoja, Nigeria) were also a part of the conference. Dr. Avakash Jadhav, critiqued the move how in many regions of the world, a key obstacle to women's empowerment legal regulatory & institutional impediments all of which are in the hands of governments to reform. **Dr. Ofure O.M. Aito**, talk focused on how family and the society play a crucial role in determining the course of lives as women. Also what we call as basic rights are still luxuries for millions of girls across the globe.

The conference also included a special address by **Ms. Neha Singh** (Director, Lucknow Public Schools & Colleges) she highlighted that Gandhi Ji said "If you educate a man you educate an individual, but if you educate a woman you educate an entire family".



While education is the fundamental towards upliftment where one should question what is the status of women in India? How many of our mothers are working? We have to agree that women are born with managerial DNA along with the DNA of primary caretakers. For example, working mothers are dedicated to making sure

that their home is in order. They are dedicated to make sure that family is well nourished and well educated and they manage to do all this beautifully while being employed. Their time management and their multitasking skills are impeccable. Why not raise our generation with this seed of thought and help them recognize this trail in their DNA.

Keynote address was given by **Dr. Alka Singh** (Associate Professor, Dr. RML Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow). Speaking at the event Dr. Alka said gender inequality starts with the skewed distribution that women face when it comes to the distribution of assets or inheritance or workplace employment or representation in socio- political institutions. Highlighting the main issue am approached by lot of women led startups & they have a single complaint that they don't get challenge.



The technical sessions of the conference pointed out that in developing countries, women are over represented in the informal sector where they face lower pay, less job security

and lower social protection. In these countries girls have dropped out more from school to help in households and there is a disturbing fact that violence against women & girls has intensified since the outbreak of pandemic. Understanding the role of the private sector, **Ms. Elena Stoikina**, said business can promote gender equity by ensuring equal pay for equal work. Even where governmental regulations do not mandate it, firms can take the initiative to put in place work- life policies that support women's labour. The conference also included a Presidential Address by **A.K. Sen Gupta** (Ex. Pro-Vice Chancellor, University of Lucknow, and Mentor of LPCPS). Prof. Sen Gupta reiterated enormous changes have taken place over the past 10 years in the world in which we live. But there is the need to look at women's issues in a holistic and developmental concerns. It will not be possible to attain sustainable development without cementing the partnership of women and men in all aspects of life.



At the end of the day vote of thanks was given by **Ms. Garima Singh** (Director, LPCPS) quoting Swami Vivekananda there is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of women is improved.

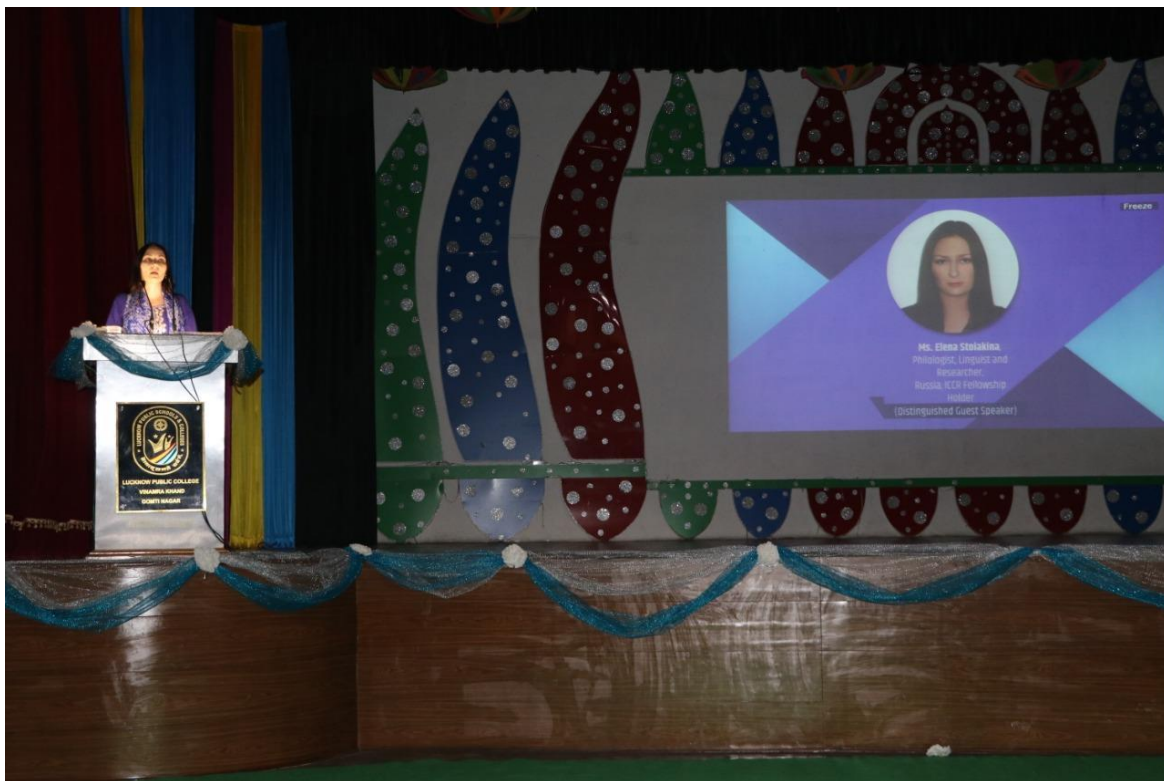

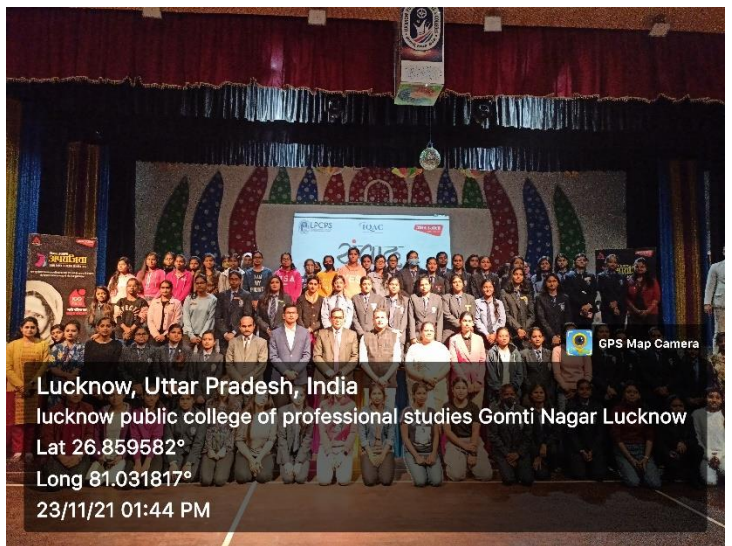
