OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE

THE PRACTICE

In alignment with the Village Adoption Policy (VAP) of Lucknow Public College of Professional Studies (LPCPS), the institution embarked on a transformative journey in 2021–22 to foster sustainable development and community engagement through village adoption. Now in its third





year, this ongoing initiative has matured into a robust program reflecting the commitment of LPCPS toward creating tangible social impact.

The process of identifying a suitable village began in the program's inaugural year with an indepth exploration of several nearby communities. Fareedpur Gram Panchayat was selected as the ideal village for adoption, given its developmental needs and the willingness of its leadership to collaborate. Recognizing the pivotal role of community involvement, Prof. (Dr.) L. S. Awasthi, Dean of Academics at LPCPS, alongside his team, initiated discussions with the village Pradhan. These deliberations, facilitated by the Pradhan Pratinidhi, led to a productive dialogue with Ms. Neetu, the esteemed Pradhan of Fareedpur Gram Panchayat.

The early discussions outlined the objectives of the Village Adoption Policy, emphasizing

LPCPS's focus on education, health sanitation. awareness. and environmental sustainability. The shared vision culminated in the *signing of a Letter* of **Understanding** (LOU)23rd on September 2023, formalizing the

partnership and setting

the stage for a collaborative approach to village development.

Since 2021–22, the program has evolved through a series of impactful engagements, with each academic session building upon the successes and lessons of the previous years. During the third year, a dedicated team of VAP volunteers, comprising faculty members like Dr. Ashish Kaushal and Mr. Chetan Khanna, along with enthusiastic students; intensified efforts to address the community's pressing needs.

A significant milestone in the current academic session was a community discussion held on 28th October 2023. This gathering brought together the Pradhan, community members, and VAP



volunteers to identify key challenges in the village. The dialogue revealed critical gaps in education, health awareness, and environmental sustainability.

In response to the identified needs, LPCPS executed a series of impactful interventions under the Village Adoption Program (VAP) for 2023–24. On 9th November 2023, a soap distribution drive was conducted to promote hygiene awareness among villagers, accompanied by discussions on the importance of cleanliness in maintaining good health. On 21st November 2023, a school visit was organized where interactive special classes were held for students to enhance their mathematical skills through engaging techniques, fostering a love for learning and academic development. On 17th February 2024, a tree plantation drive was carried out, involving villagers and students in planting saplings to promote sustainability and ecological awareness. Lastly, on 6th May 2024, a voter awareness campaign was conducted to educate the villagers about their voting rights and

responsibilities, aiming to encourage active and informed participation in the democratic process.

The collaborative spirit between LPCPS and Fareedpur Gram Panchayat, cultivated over the past three years, underscores the importance of sustained

engagement and shared responsibility. Each activity conducted under the VAP framework represents a step forward in addressing the village's developmental needs, fostering self-reliance, and ensuring a brighter future for the community.

As the program progresses into its third year, LPCPS remains committed to refining and expanding its efforts, reaffirming its dedication to holistic development and community empowerment within Fareedpur Gram Panchayat.

Soap Distribution – 9th November 2023

On 9th November 2023, as part of the ongoing Village Adoption Program (VAP), LPCPS organized a Soap Distribution drive in Fareedpur Gram Panchayat, aiming to promote hygiene and sanitation within the village. The distribution was aligned with the VAP's broader objective of improving health and well-being among rural communities. The team, comprising of students and faculty members from LPCPS, visited households across the village to distribute soaps while simultaneously engaging with the villagers on the importance of cleanliness.

The activity wasn't merely about providing soap, but also about educating the children on the crucial role hygiene plays in preventing illnesses. Discussions focused on the importance of washing hands regularly, particularly before meals, after using the restroom, and after touching

potentially contaminated surfaces. Volunteers also demonstrated proper handwashing techniques, ensuring that the villagers understood the steps involved in maintaining good hygiene.



One of the key aspects of this initiative was its

School Visit – 21st November 2023

under the guidance of faculty members Dr. Ashish Kaushal and Mr. Chetan Khanna, set up an interactive classroom environment that aimed to make learning an enjoyable and engaging experience. Students were encouraged to actively participate through hands-on activities, solving problems together, and using visual aids to better understand abstract mathematical concepts. These techniques were carefully chosen to make learning more dynamic and relatable to the village students.

One of the key goals of the visit was to instill confidence in students by providing them with methods to solve mathematical problems faster and more efficiently. The activities included fun exercises such as math games, puzzles, and competitions that motivated students to participate enthusiastically. The reward system was also introduced, where students who answered questions





correctly were given small prizes. This added an element of excitement and encouraged students to remain attentive and focused during the classes.

The response from the students was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing a newfound interest in mathematics and a greater desire to learn. The visit also provided an opportunity for the VAP team to assess the infrastructure and resources available at the school. The school's Principal acknowledged the impact of the special classes, stating that such initiatives could go a long way in supplementing formal education and helping students excel academically.

Tree Plantation Drive – 17th February 2024

PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED

Throughout the execution of the Village Adoption Program (VAP) for the academic year 2023-2024, several challenges emerged, which required strategic problem-solving and resource management to ensure the successful implementation and sustainability of the program. One of the significant challenges faced was motivating both students and villagers to actively engage in community-oriented activities. Involving individuals in a rural development program required effective communication to highlight the value of experiential learning, community service, and social responsibility. Convincing participants of the program's long-term benefits and its impact on their personal and academic growth was crucial to securing their commitment.

Balancing the village's needs with the available resources was another critical challenge. The community's requirements spanned across multiple domains such as health, education, and sanitation, while resources like funding, volunteer availability, and materials were finite. Ensuring that each initiative was appropriately funded and executed without exceeding the available resources required careful planning and prioritization. Managing financial support was also a major issue. Ensuring the smooth transportation of volunteers to the village and covering the costs of materials and logistics for events like soap distribution, tree plantation, and educational classes was essential. Securing sufficient funding and managing it efficiently for transportation and material procurement was an ongoing challenge. Despite these challenges, the ongoing support from faculty, students, and the village community has contributed significantly to the program's successful execution. Looking forward, strengthening partnerships with local organizations, government agencies, and potential donors could further ensure the smooth execution of VAP activities and address any remaining resource gaps.

The VAP intends to address the issues of the village through various kinds of awareness programmes. In this connection, the policy makes provisions for some of the awareness programmes such as education, health and sanitation, tree plantation, 'Swaachata', gender sensitization, social taboos etc.

4.2.2 Vocational skills:

The VAP advocates promotion of livelihood apportunities for the villagers, in general, and women and youth; in particular. The College needs to initiate generating of the vocational skills. Local villagers are to be motivated to be involved in acquiring vocational skills keeping in the view the future scope of the same. The VAP also makes provisions for organization of workshops and handson training programmes on livelihood skills with indigenous techniques. Thus, the policy aims at enhancing the knowledge and skills on different livelihood avenues among men and women.

4.2.3 Educating school-going students:

The VAP advocates initiatives to offer assistance to the school-going students of the village in their academic and non-academic affairs. The policy also intends to assist the rising generation with educational, vocational and personal guidance. The policy intends to ensure universal and equal access to educational facilities amongst the children. The policy also urges to take steps for adult literacy programmes.

4.2.4 Assistance to the villagers:

The VAP advocates that the College needs to be involved wholeheartedly for offering helping hands to the needy people of the village in non-monetary forms at the time of their hardship.





PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED

However, despite our earnest endeavors, we observed following problems encountered during the Session:

Approval Acquisition Challenges:

Gaining approvals from principals of 10+2 schools proved to be a complex and time-consuming task. It necessitated extensive communication, negotiation, and persuasion to align our program's objectives with the schools' academic agendas. Despite concerted efforts, securing consensus often posed challenges due to varied priorities and scheduling conflicts.

Financial Management Hurdles:

Managing the expenses associated with organizing these sessions presented significant challenges. Detailed financial planning and precise resource allocation were essential to cover costs for materials, venue arrangements, transportation, and facilitator fees. Balancing the budget amid various requirements proved demanding and required meticulous attention to ensure the smooth execution of each session.

Addressing Financial Constraints of Guardians:

Despite the program's efforts to highlight the importance of higher education, certain guardians encountered financial barriers. Affording higher education expenses became a significant concern for some families, hindering students' aspirations. Recognizing this obstacle, the college initiated proactive measures by offering freeship. These freeship aim to complement existing government aid programs, easing the financial burden on deserving students and their guardians.

Effective communication strategies, including well-drafted proposals, informational brochures, and persuasive presentations, are crucial resources needed to secure approvals from school principals. Streamlining communication channels and crafting convincing arguments are vital components in gaining consensus and support.

Detailed financial planning tools, expertise in budget allocation, and adept financial management skills are essential resources required to navigate the complexities of managing session expenses. These resources aid in meticulous budgeting, accurate forecasting, and judicious allocation of funds to ensure the efficient execution of sessions without compromising quality.

Educational Material and Session Resources:

Necessary materials such as presentation tools, educational handouts, multimedia resources, and session materials are indispensable resources required for delivering impactful sessions. Ensuring the availability and relevance of these resources enhances the effectiveness and engagement of the sessions.


