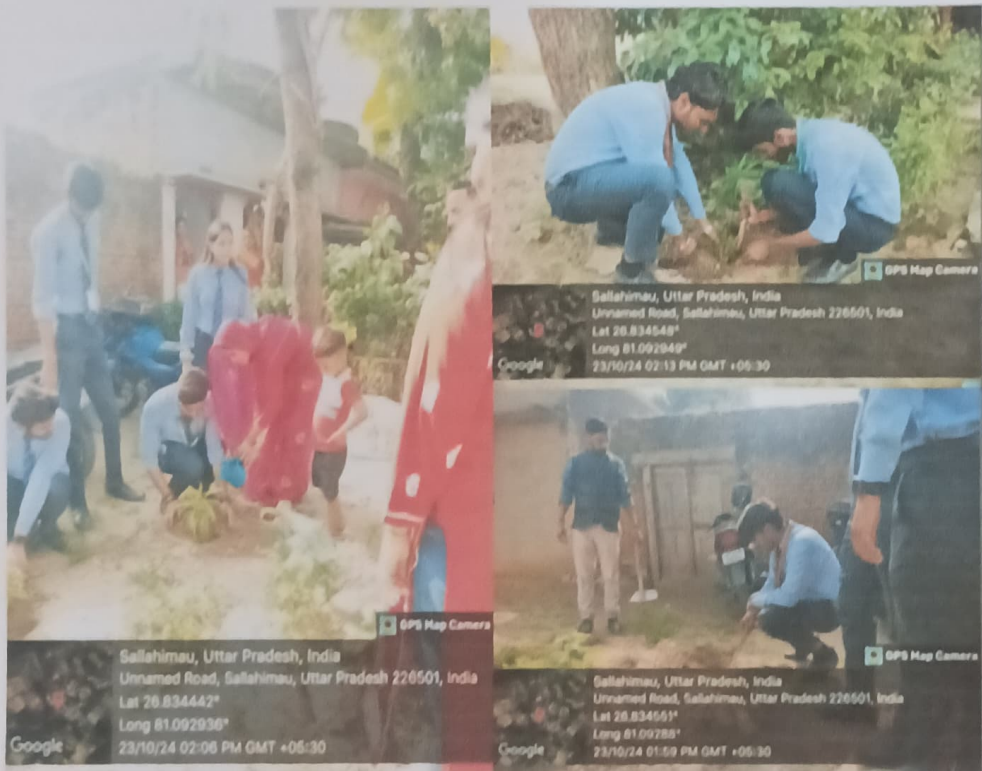

Brief about the activity:

The 2024 edition of the drive was organised on **23 December 2024** with the objective of supporting the underprivileged during the harsh winter season and inculcating social responsibility among students.

Session on Anti- Ragging

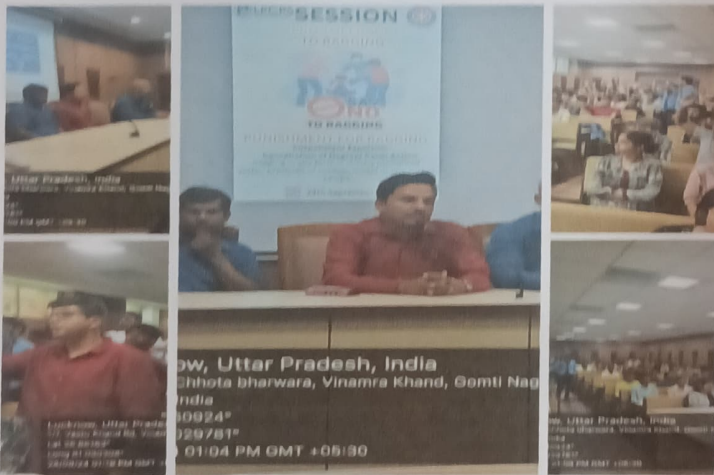

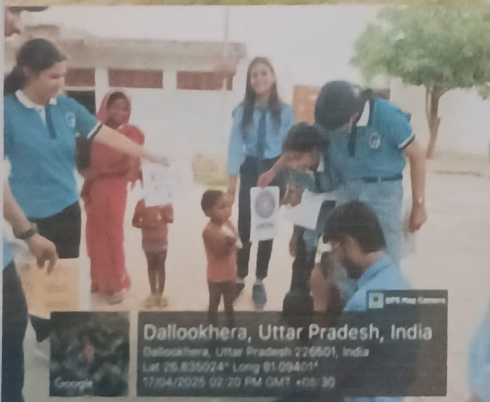
Venue: Villages Sallahimau and Dallookhera, District Lucknow

Brief about the activity:

Poshan Pakhwada 2025 was observed nationwide from 8 April to 22 April as part of the Government of India's "Poshan Abhiyaan", implemented by the Ministry of Women and Child Development in collaboration with various ministries and state governments. The campaign focuses on improving the nutritional status of children and women, promoting maternal and child nutrition, encouraging the use of digital nutrition trackers and addressing childhood obesity.

Under this initiative, the NSS Unit of Lucknow Public College of Professional Studies (LPCPS) organised a community outreach programme on 17 April 2025 in the villages Sallahimau and Dallookhera, District Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh (226501). A group of 14 NSS student volunteers, led by Dr. Ashish Kaushal, Associate Professor and NSS Coordinator, and Mr. Chetan Khanna, Assistant Professor and NSS Coordinator, visited households and interacted with children and mothers.

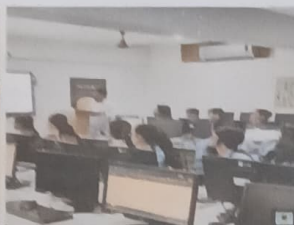

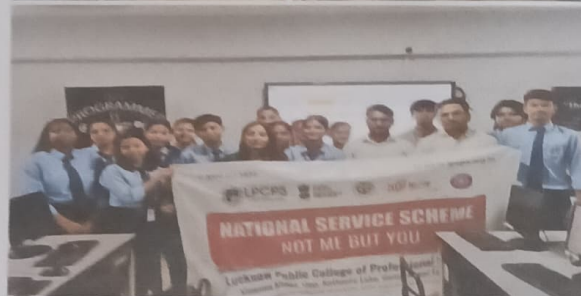
In conclusion, the boot camp offered a valuable learning opportunity, equipping students with essential Excel skills that will contribute significantly to their academic growth and future career success.

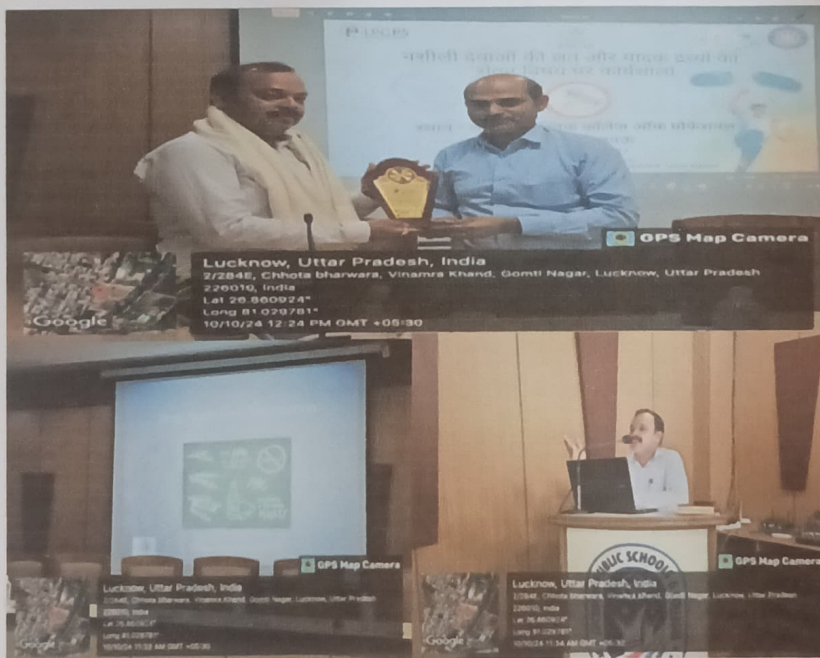
Venue: Conference Hall, LPCPS

The programme was coordinated by the NSS unit. The resource person for the session was **Shri Anil Kumar Vishwakarma, Sahayak Narkotics Ayukt, Kendriya Narcotics Bureau, Lucknow**. A total of **157 students** along with faculty members enthusiastically attended the programme.

Shri Vishwakarma delivered a detailed presentation on different categories of narcotic and psychotropic substances, their short-term and long-term impact on physical and mental health, and the social and economic consequences of addiction. He also familiarised the participants with relevant provisions of the NDPS Act, legal responsibilities of educational institutions and procedures for reporting suspicious activities.

An interactive question-answer session enabled students and faculty to clarify doubts and share experiences. Brief about the activity:

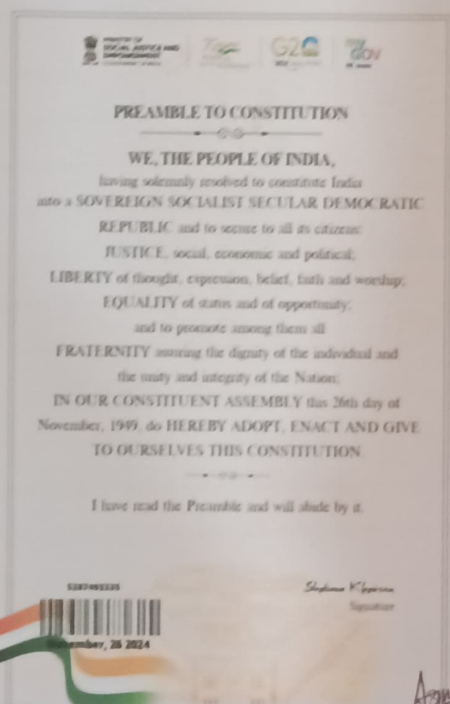
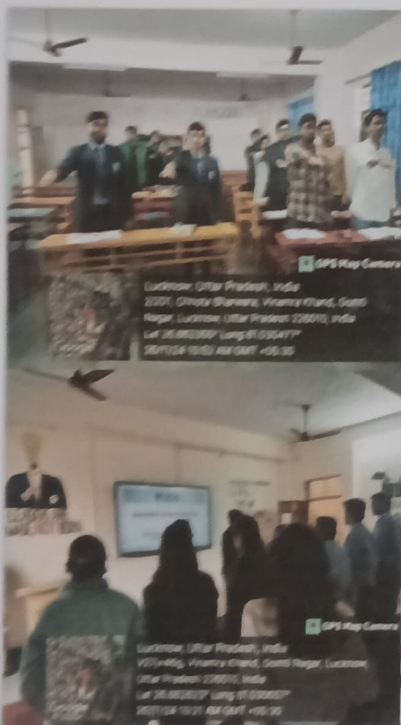
